Will Messenger Executive Editor Theology of Work Project



William G. Messenger is the Executive Editor of the Theology of Work Project, Inc., an international organization dedicated to researching, writing, and circulating materials about how the Christian faith can contribute to non-church workplaces. Its materials are available at www.theologyofwork.org. The TOW Project also helps faith-and-work organizations, pastors, and Christians in the workplace work more closely together to equip their

members for meaningful and fruitful work in the world. It intends to complete its first phase of research and writing during 2013 and to invite participants to join in a shared expression of how the Christian applies to work.

Will was the Director of the Mockler Center for Faith and Ethics in the Workplace at Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary from 1999 to 2008, and an adjunct faculty member there. He created and led the seminary's doctoral and master's degree programs in workplace leadership and business ethics. He presently serves as an adjunct professor of business ethics at Fordham University and a guest lecturer at Holy Cross College, and previously taught at Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute.

Will is a member of the Board of Directors of ArQule, Inc., a biotechnology company near Boston, where he chairs the compensation, nominating and governance committee and is a member of the audit committee. He previously worked as a sales representative at IBM, corporate finance associate at Goldman Sachs, consultant at McKinsey & Co., and vice president of sales and marketing Advanced Metabolic Systems. Will is ordained in the Episcopal Church and formerly served as pastor of Charles River Church in Boston and assistant rector of All Saints' Episcopal Church in Belmont, MA. He was awarded a B.S. in Physics from Case Western Reserve University, an M.B.A. from Harvard Business School, a Master of Divinity from Boston University School of Theology and a Doctor of Ministry from Gordon-Conwell Theological Seminary. Will was born in 1960. He lives in Belmont, MA, with his wife and their two daughters.

GORDON PREECE

Gordon Preece has worked for churches, with the Education Program for Unemployed Youth and taught professional ethics at tertiary level for 20 years, including directing centres for applied ethics. His specialty is the ethics of work, professions and business. Gordon has written or edited eleven books including "Christianity and Entrepreneurship" and "Changing Work Values". He has lectured in universities in Sydney and Melbourne and

in the US, Canada, Cambridge (UK), New Zealand, Indonesia and St Petersburg. He has wide local and global experience of workplace ethics. Gordon was Director of Macquarie Christian Studies Institute and Urban Seed, Melbourne, a not for profit working with marginalized people. He is now ethicist for Christian Super, adjunct lecturer in Ethics for Ridley College Melbourne and Director of Ethos: EA Centre for Christianity and Society and Senior Minister in the Anglican Parish of Yarraville. Gordon is married to Susan, a mental health and aging educator and has three young adult children, all married off in the past year.
